



## APICS Principles of Inventory Management 24 Hrs

This course provides participants with an operational knowledge and understanding of inventory management principles and techniques. Among the topics presented are inventory management fundamentals, ordering techniques, replenishment policies, and inventory performance measurement.

Basic methods of planning and controlling inventory in manufacturing, institutional, distribution, and retail environments are covered. The questions of what to stock are addressed through an examination of current and evolving technologies of inventory management.

The course offers a classroom-based, instructor-led educational opportunity for people new to inventory management or for those with experience who want to gain additional insight and expand their skills. Participants gain practical, essential skills that help them become more effective and productive in their jobs.

### **Course Objectives:**

- Provide a fundamental understanding of inventory management principles and techniques
- Examine inventory control roles and responsibilities and their impact on a business
